National Hispanic Cultural Center

Explore this world-class center for Hispanic arts and culture featuring captivating exhibitions, thought-provoking literary works, live performances and one of the largest fresco murals in North America.

Indian Pueblo Cultural Center

Take an in-depth guided tour exploring the rich heritage of the 19 Pueblos of New Mexico and indulge in authentic Native American cuisine at **Indian Pueblo Kitchen**.

Turquoise Museum

This museum takes visitors on a journey through the fascinating world of turquoise. From its ornamental use to its ceremonial significance, the museum showcases an array of exhibits featuring exquisite examples of New Mexico's state gem.

Anderson Abruzzo Albuquerque International Balloon Museum

This museum showcases one of the most impressive collections of hot air ballooning equipment and memorabilia, providing visitors with an immersive experience into the art, culture, science, history, sport and spectacle of ballooning.

New Mexico Museum of Natural History & Science

Get interactive at this high-tech museum with a planetarium, theater, lots of dinosaur fossils and hands-on experiences for all ages.
